Beekeeping then and now

For centuries men have kept bees because of products such as honey and wax. 12.000 year-old rock paintings even give evidence of the full range of bee products.

Archeological excavations in the area of present day Germany prove beekeeping as early as 500 BC.

Apiculture with specially produced artificial dwellings is over 4000 years old. In modern beehives bees find ideal conditions to collect and produce honey. And the apiarist finds perfect conditions to harvest the stored honey later.

Beekeeping is of high ecological value since many plants depend on bees to propagate. Of course agricultural crops' blossoms profit too as their yield can be increased.

In the long run the partnerlike cooperation of modern agriculture and beekeeping secures high harvests in fruit and berry cultivation as well as crop cultivation.

For the food industry, the production of honey, bee wax and pollen is essential.
